O R D I N A N C E

ORDINANCE REQUIRING LICENSE FOR PUBLIC ENTERTAINMENT:

Approved July 12<sup>th</sup>, 1972

Be it ordained by the Town Council of the Town of West Greenwich,  
as follows:

SECTION 1. APPLICATION:

No person shall hold any public entertainment within the Town of West Greenwich without first filing a written application for a license to do so with the Town Council of said Town. Said application shall be filed not later than seven days prior to the next regular meeting of said Town Council, provided, however, that said Town Council may waive this requirement on good cause shown by the applicant.

SECTION 2. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS:

No license shall issue by said Town Council until the applicant or applicants shall affirmatively show that the proposed entertainment, if allowed, or the premises to be used therefor, if allowed, shall otherwise comply with all applicable Federal, State and local laws relative to the health, safety and welfare of the public, including, but not limited to: Traffic, zoning, parking, fire protection, and the like.

SECTION 3. SPECIAL EXPENSES:

The Town Clerk, upon the granting by the Town Council of such a license, shall forthwith notify the Chief of Police of the granting of said license, the time or times and place or places that said public entertainment will occur, and deliver to said Chief a copy of the license so granted. The Chief of Police shall assign a constable who shall be present at the premises at all times when the premises are used for such public entertainment, provided, however, that the licensee shall pay for the services of such constable at the then prevailing rate therefor. The licensee shall also be required to pay for all other special expenses incurred as a result of the granting of the license. The agreement by the licensee to pay the expenses hereinabove set forth shall be a condition to the granting thereof by the Town Council.

SECTION 4. VIOLATION:

Any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be fined not less than Five Dollars and no more than Ten Dollars for each offense.

SECTION 5. REPEAL OF PRIOR ORDINANCE:

All sections or parts of any other ordinance inconsistent herewith, including, but not limited to, an Ordinance dated March 14, 1949 and entitled "Licenses for Public Entertainments" are hereby repealed.

SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE:

This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

A M E N D M E N T

ORDINANCE IN AMENDMENT OF ORDINANCE REQUIRING LICENSE FOR  
PUBLIC ENTERTAINMENT, APPROVED JULY 12, 1972.

Approved August 13<sup>th</sup>, 1975

Be it ordained by the Town Council of the Town of West Greenwich,  
as follows:

SECTION 1: Section 2. of "Ordinance Requiring License for Public  
Entertainment" approved July 12, 1972, is hereby amended by addition of  
the following paragraph immediately after the existing first paragraph  
of said Section 2:

No license shall be issued to any applicant currently  
in arrears in any tax or assessment levied by the Town  
of West Greenwich, or for use upon any premises for which  
any such taxes or assessments are unpaid at the time of  
the filing of the application. The applicant seeking such  
license shall submit proof that all such taxes and assess-  
ments have been paid at the time the application is filed.

SECTION 2: Said "Ordinance Requiring License For Public Entertain-  
ment" approved July 12, 1972, shall, in all other respects, remain in full  
force and effect.

SECTION 3: This amendment shall take effect upon its passage.
